further improve business environment.

**Dar es Salaam.** President John Magufuli's initiatives towards promoting industrialisation, winning investors' confidence and further improve business environment will be the main issues during 11th Tanzania National Business Council (TNBC) meeting scheduled for Monday at State House.

TNBC executive secretary Raymond Mbilinyi told reporters in the city yesterday that the Council will offer an opportunity for deliberation of areas that need adjustments so as to reorient the economic direction for better results.

"Many changes have taken place

since the last meeting when President Magufuli became the national chairman. We want to use his bold initiatives to consolidate economic gains, create jobs and further win big investors' confidence," he said.

The Tanzania National Business Council (TNBC) is the 40-members dialogue mechanism with equal representation from both the private sector as well as the Government. The current representation from government is composed of Cabinet Ministers, Attorney General and Governor of the Central Bank.

Private sector representations include Board Members to TPSF who emanate from sector apex bodies and other key representatives of investors, business leaders, small scale entrepreneurs as well as large industries.
